You do not have to walk through this very difficult grieving season alone. We are here to support you and empower you to make decisions for your baby and family that will foster healing and hope.

Justin Brady** for prayer, blessing, guidance, help navigating ethical medical decisions, and/or funeral/graveside service/burial planning. We recommend Nampa Funeral Home or Dakan Funeral Home for handling your sweet baby's body while you prepare for burial. They can pick your baby up from the hospital (if applicable) and help you with any funeral or cremation needs.

Antonio can give you all the burial options available and help you set up burial for your sweet baby.

Plots/Niches are available for miscarried babies. St. Paul's offers a designated shared niche in the cemetery's columbarium for miscarried babies of parishioners for those who choose to use it. This shared niche is provided by the Catholic Miscarriage Ministry at low to no cost. We ask for a \$200 donation (or whatever you can afford) to go toward the ministry and help keep this niche option available to those who need it. Individual plots and niches are available too. Antonio can provide all information, including current costs, for those who wish to purchase a private burial plot or niche.

— We recommend Heaven's Gain for purchase of little caskets ([www.heavensgain.org](http://www.heavensgain.org)). (Or make your own if you prefer... purchase of a vault may be necessary if burying in the ground). There are a couple options available via St. Paul's Miscarriage Ministry for those who cannot afford to purchase a casket/vault on their own and wish to bury their baby in ground (rather than inter in a niche). If you are in need of a burial vessel other than the one enclosed in the kit and cannot afford to purchase one on your own, please speak with Tami Gieseke (contact info above).

— Reilly's Church Supply (Catholic Store in Boise) for religious items that can be placed in casket with baby, kept in memory on an altar at home or in a scrapbook, etc.

— Local Mass/Remembrance Events:

~ Attend St. Paul's annual Mass for Loss of a Child in September/October (close to Our Lady of Sorrows feast day, please feel free to call the church office for exact date of next Mass and/or check the bulletin in late August/beginning of September)
